### Our Mission

The Salesian Boys' & Girls' Club's mission is to serve children between the ages of 8 and 18 by accompanying them, with loving kindness, on their journey to adulthood. This is done by channeling their energy into athletic, educational, cultural, artistic, and career-building programs. All children are welcome regardless of race, religion or gender, and special emphasis is given to children from disadvantaged families.


### Notable Accomplishments in the 2024-2025 Fiscal Year

- Attendance levels rose to the highest levels in our recent history with upwards of 200+ members each day. The Board feels these attendance records further validates the value the Club is bringing to our members, their families and the community at large.
- The Club distributed \$340,000 in financial need scholarships to 11 College students, 23 High School students and 23 K-8 students (57 students total). This is the largest scholarship contribution the Club has made in its 104-year history.
- To better serve our members, The Club revamped the Scholarship Program under the leadership of current Board President Joe Braucher.
- Thanks to the generosity of the Joseph A. Crivello Trust and the Sangiacomo Family Foundation, The Club will increase its Scholarship Endowment by \$750,000.
- Four (4) Club-alumni members are utilizing the Carlo Riberio and Norma Paganini Riberio Scholarship at the University of San Francisco. This financial aid scholarship is earmarked for Club Kids.
- To ensure a durable and robust process for managing The Club's investments, which is our lifeline for the future, we vetted and selected The Capital Group for managing our funds.
- The Club honored Claudio Cipollina as our Person of the Year at the annual Gala for his many contributions including serving as a liaise between The Club and one of our largest financial contributors, the Bank of America. Claudio's father, Alberto Cipollina was a past recipient of this award in 1996.
- Former Board President and current Nominating Committee Chair, Frank Lavin, was honored as The Club's Fr. Trincheri Award winner. Frank was a "Club Kid" growing up and he exemplifies paying it forward with his impactful engagement in driving the future direction of our organization.
- Lisa Guminia Rivera (Center back row) was recognized as our Bertha Bedoni Award winner in 2025. Lisa has positively affected The Club by mentoring our members, supporting our fundraising events and guiding our volunteers. Lisa has continued the long association of the Guminia family with The Club, with her father Russ serving as our past Executive Director.



## Who do we serve?

- Members are between the ages 8 (3<sup>rd</sup> grade) to 18 (12<sup>th</sup> grade) with 52% boys and 48% girls.
- We currently support 210 - 250 children per day during the school year.
- Approximately 43% of the families we serve have reported a house-hold income less than \$125,000/year.
- Less than 20% of our members are from private parochial schools.



## What services do we provide?

## When do we serve our members?

- The Club is open to our members year-round.
- Hours during the school year are 1:30 pm to 6 pm. Summer hours are 9am to 6pm.

## Where do we serve our members?

After securing all funding before starting construction, in 2015 a major renovation to The Club was completed. Our ADA-compliant facility includes a full-length indoor basketball court, kitchen for cooking classes, a theater room,

martial arts room, arts & crafts room, homework room with computers, several game rooms and a secure outdoor playground.

### Why do we serve?

- In 1921, The Club primarily served first-generation boys of Italian descent whose fathers were away at sea as fishermen.
- Fast forward to today, The Club's leadership feels that with the all pulls of modern life on families, our programs help members successfully transition into adulthood.

### How do we serve?

While we are a separate non-religious organization from nearby Saints Peter & Paul Church and School, we model the methodology of St. John Bosco by creating a safe, caring and loving environment for our members. This atmosphere is conducive to our members' development into adulthood and enables life-long friendships.





Both Kim and Dante made immediate impacts in their respective roles as Program Director and Program Manager. Their combination of experience and energy has brought a new level of excitement to the organization, and we look forward to seeing their contributions in fiscal year 2026 and beyond.

As our last fiscal year came to a close in June of 2025, the Board voted to move The Club's investment portfolio to the Capital Group to further ensure the financial stability of our organization. I would like to acknowledge Jerome Paolini, Frank Lavin and Tom Lockard for their leadership of this critical effort.

As the Chair of the Education Committee, I had the opportunity to lead a project to formally document our Scholarship Program. I had the pleasure of working with our extraordinary consultant, JoEllen "Joey" Baker along with our COO, Sherri Hughston and Board Member, Diana Whitehead. With the support of the Scholarship Committee and the Board of Directors, we completed the project in June of 2025. We feel the formally documented program will help us identify and attract additional funding for the Scholarship Program as we look to expand one of our most valuable resources. The Club's commitment to education has been a foundation of our organization since it was founded in 1921. On a personal level, as a past recipient of the *Carlo Ribero and Norma Paganini Ribero Scholarship* at the University of San Francisco, I recognize the opportunities that the Scholarship Program creates for our members.

## FINANCIAL SUMMARY

### Revenues from Activities (see top graph on next page)

Part of our heritage is to provide outstanding programs and services at a low cost to our members, currently \$10/year, which represents less than 1% of The Club's revenue. To realize this goal, restricted endowments have been established for Programs and Scholarships. Please contact us if you are interested in contributing to these funds.

Relative to the average of the three (3) previous fiscal years, a larger percentage of The Club's revenue in the 2024-2025 fiscal year was realized from Foundations (36% vs. 24%) and from Investment Income (30% vs. 19%). As an organization, we are grateful to those Foundations that supported our important work.


### Expenses from Activities (see bottom graph on next page)

There was no change in The Club's spending for Fundraising, Development and Community Building in the last fiscal year at 32%. These activities help to offset the low membership dues.


Programs and Services spending increased on a relative basis compared to the average of the three (3) prior fiscal year (51% vs 44%). In other words, in the 2024 – 2025 fiscal year over half of The Club's expenses went to directly serve our members.
